English: Non-chronological report

Children will study Ancient Egyptians. The Nonchronological report will link to the History unit of learning.

Activities at home:

Learn about hieroglyphics and write secret messages for your family to decode!

Mathematics: Place Value and calculation

Children will learn the place value of numbers up to 1000. They will answer calculations in a formal written way using these numbers.

Activities at home:

TTRS timetable practise of all tables up to 12.

Science: Animals including humans (teeth)

Children will learn about the digestive system of different animals and the teeth of carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.

Activities at home:

Go to your dentist appointment and discuss the importance of dental hygiene!

Physical Education: Swimming and Gymnastics

Children will develop flexibility, strength, technique, control and balance in Gymnastics. They will travel to Poplar Baths to begin their swimming lessons.

Activities at home:

Prep your swimming kit and become water confident! Visit a local swimming pool with your family.

Art and Design: Fabric of Nature

Children will create a repeating pattern for a fabric design.

Activities at home:

Find repeating patterns in the environment.

Create your own by drawing, collage or printing.

History: Ancient Egyptians

Children will learn about life in Ancient Egypt by looking at artefacts, primary and secondary sources.

Activities at home:

Create a fact file about the Egyptians. Research Pharaohs and write as if you are one. Visit the British Museum.

Religious Education: Christianity

Children will learn about Christianity and why Jesus is inspiring to some people.

Activities at home:

Have a walk in the local area — how many different places of worship can you see?

Computing: Fake or Real?

Pupils will be equipped with the skills to consider which information is fake and which is real.

Activities at home:

Practise typing on a computer
Use a search engine to research sources, about
Ancient Egypt and identify if it is real of fake.

Activities at home:


Teach your family members! Record yourself speaking Spanish and replay to check and improve your pronunciation.

As well as your English and Mathematics homework, there are different activities you can complete that link to other units of learning. Choose some activities off this sheet and bring them in to show your class!




Research the diets of animals!
