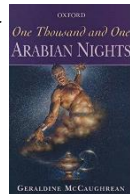


Year 6 Autumn 1 Pupil Learning Map



English: Diary Entry and Short Story

Children will study the book 'One Thousand and One Arabian Nights' and use this to inspire them write a diary entry and a short story.



Activities at home:

Keep a diary at home over the summer holidays.

Mathematics: Number

Children will learn the place value of numbers and the four operations.

Activities at home:

Practise times tables at home.
Calculating the weekly shopping using knowledge of rounding and estimating.



Science: Light

Children will complete investigations to understand how light travels and how objects cast shadows. They will also carry out a fair test to show which material is the best at reflecting light.



Activities at home:

Use objects and sources of light to cast shadows.

Physical Education: Netball & Residential

Children will build on their basic understanding of netball from Year 3. Children will have the opportunity to carry out a number of different activities at Gorsefield.



Activities at home:

Practise netball in the pitch on Bigland Street.

Art and Design: Craft & Design

Children will undergo a photography unit and experiment with how to take photos using angles and light.



Activities at home:

Use phones or other available devices at home to practise taking photos over the summer break.

History: World War II

Children will learn about the alliances Britain had in WW2 and the impact the war had on our local area of Tower Hamlets.



Activities at home:

Research the different countries involved in WW2 and which countries had alliances with each other.

Religious Education: Christianity and Humanism

Children will identify what Christians and Humanists believe about God and what matters most to them.

Activities at home:

Research humanism or visit a local Church.



Computing: Online Safety Dilemmas

Children will learn how to be safe online, interpret and resolve any threats.

Activities at home:

Practise typing on a computer.



Music: World Unite

Children will work towards a music performance, involving step dance.

Activities at home:

Listen to music – can you identify the beat?



Modern Foreign Languages: Spanish

Children will begin to speak about themselves, the time and their daily life in Spanish.
