## FAMILY HOLIDAYS IN TERM TIME

Parents should ensure that family holidays and term time leave are arranged outside of school term time. We have seen a large influx of parents taking holidays especially as we come closer to the end of the Autumn

term. Children should not be removed from school during term time without a leave of absence first being requested and please note they will only be authorised in extreme circumstances. If permission is not granted, the absence will be classified as unauthorised. Pupils with three or more unauthorised absences will receive a Fixed Penalty Notice.

## REPORTING AN ABSENCE



As a parent, you are legally responsible for ensuring your child receives a full-time education and attends

school regularly. If your child is absent, this needs to be reported to the Attendance Officer or school office as soon as possible with a valid reason. This can be done via phone, email or Parent Hub. If we do not hear from you, the absence will remain unauthorised.
