### Make it make sense:

What can you identify before reading the text?

Children to use their inference skills to build their understanding

- I can see a man wearing a white suit. I think it might be a space suit because I can see a rocket flying up in space
- I can see that the character is very organised as he neatly hung his clothes up
- I can see a newspaper- The character might like reading newspapers in the morning

Children to read the text and identify the key words. This gives them a chance to explain unfamiliar words in context.

### Make it sound good:

Encourage your child to read expression and prosody.




