PARENT CONSULTATION WORKSHOP



Thank you to all the parents who attended and gave their valuable feedback on the school's consultation on (a) pupils' uniform, and (b) term dates which took place on Monday.

School uniform: The proposal is that from September 2023 pupils' jumpers/cardigans must have the school logo. The school will purchase jumpers/cardigans with logo which parents can purchase at the cost price which will be around £10 to £12 each. Parents can also stitch-on a logo patch that will be available for purchase from the school office. The vast majority of parents agreed that this proposal be implemented from September 2023 for Reception to Year 6 (Nursery will remain optional).

Term dates: The proposal is to shorten the summer break from six weeks to five weeks. Increase the Christmas/Winter break and keep everything else the same. Parents were in favour of this proposal and wanted it to be implemented from next academic year if feasible.

It was explained that any changes will need to have the support of all stakeholders, particularly the staff members. Childcare and other demands on parents and staff members will also need to be carefully considered before making a final decision. The school is consulting all key stakeholders this week.
