
SHAKESPEARE FESTIVAL

time is wasted due to arguments


between different pupils.

Last week, Year 3 went to the Shakespeare's Globe Theatre to explore Shakespearean world and English language as part of their learning in English. They are studying Julius Caesar, and are excited to learn more about the importance of his theatre and the stories that he wrote.



During the visit pupils had a quick tour, and a chance to perform on the stage. They participated in an interactive workshop where they acted being different characters and expressed various emotions. All pupils felt confident and overjoyed after the workshop as they understood how to perform their character effectively in front of an audience.

WORKSHOP FOR YEARS 5 AND 6

Year 5 and 6 thoroughly enjoyed their workshops with Freshwater Theatre Company this week. The workshops focussed on using their diaphragm to project their voices and on understanding the main parts of the plays they will be performing next Thursday during the Shakespeare Festival.

LEARNING IN LAVENDER CLASS

Lavender class have been learning about storms and waves. They watched videos and looked at pictures of storms at sea, thinking carefully about the tall towering waves, dark skies, how lightning lights up the dark sky and we hear thunder rumbling. After looking at pictures of storms and crashing waves, they created their own art using colouring pens and sugar





paper. This is all linked to their learning of the Tempest, which they will be performing during the Shakespeare festival. They have learnt specific songs and made wavy headbands, which they are excited to wear when performing to our parents next week.
